

LIEUTENANT-COLONEL (RET'D) DANIEL REDBURN, ONM, CD

Biography



LCol (Ret'd) Redburn is a graduate of the *Collège militaire royal de Saint-Jean* and an officer of the Royal 22^e Régiment.

His regimental duties included serving with the 1st Battalion in Lahr West Germany, the 2nd Battalion in Québec City and the 3rd Battalion in Valcartier. He held a number of staff positions such as Instructor at the Infantry School in Gagetown, Operation Officer at 4 Canadian Mechanized Brigade Group Headquarters in West Germany and Project Officer at Land Force Québec Area Headquarters in Montreal.

From 1993 to 1995, he was the Commanding Officer of 3rd Battalion Royal 22^e Régiment and Estrie Garrison in Farnham. During his tenure of office, he led his unit reinforced as a Battle Group for a six-month operational deployment in Bosnia-Herzegovina. For a short duration, he was posted as a Senior Staff Officer at the Land Force Command Headquarters prior to returning again to Bosnia-Herzegovina as Assistant Military Advisor to the Special Representative of the United Nations Secretary General for 10 months. From 1998 to 2001, he was posted at the Canadian Embassy in Paris as Military Attaché and then returned to Canada as Director – Program Implementation and Security at Rideau Hall (Ottawa).

In 2003, LCol Redburn was posted in Africa to Operation SOLITUDE as Commander *Task Force Dakar* and Military Advisor to the Special Representative of the United Nations Secretary General for West Africa. During his one-year mission, his duties required him to work mainly in Senegal, Cameroon and Nigeria with the Cameroon-Nigeria Mixed Commission. In 2004, LCol Redburn returned to Canada as Chief of Personnel at the Land Force Québec Area Headquarters located in Montreal. He retired from the Canadian Forces in 2005 after 35 years of service. In 2007, he undertook a second career as Chief Trainer with the security agency *The Commissionaires* in Montreal.

In 2011, he joined the Last Post Fund as Regional Director for the Québec Region and as Director of the Last Post Fund National Field of Honour.

LCol Redburn is a graduate of the Canadian Forces Staff School (Toronto), the Canadian Land Force Command and Staff College (Kingston) and the French war College at Paris (France). He also holds a Bachelor of Science degree from Sherbrooke University. He received the Head of the Federal Public Service award in 2002 and was made Chevalier de l'Ordre National du Mérite by French Government in 2003. Born in Québec City, he is married to Christiane Quintin since 1975 and they have two children, Alexandra and Carl-David.
